99th Annual Meeting - The Potato Association of America
July 19-23, 2015 - Portland, Maine USA

The Maine LAC is pleased to announce that there are over 90 papers and posters slated for the 99th Annual Meeting in Portland, Maine. Registrations have been slow so far, but we expect that to change quickly as soon as the program is published online in few weeks. You won't want to miss this event and the opportunity to enjoy coastal Maine. As a reminder, lodging and meeting space will be in the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel in South Portland, 7 miles or 13 minutes from the downtown Portland waterfront. The hotel rates and meeting registration fees were published in the January newsletter and can be found on the meeting website www.paaannualmeeting.org.

If you are inclined to come to Maine early or stay late here are a few ideas that might interest you. Fort Fairfield is five hours north of Portland, but the Annual Maine Potato Blossom Festival is a week-long event that concludes on July 18 with a huge parade. Also, just 10 minutes north of Portland will be the Yarmouth Clam Festival on July 17-19. Following our meeting, up the Maine coast an hour Wiscasset holds its annual Summerfest on July 25. If you prefer to stay in Portland Friday night July 24, the Tedeschi Trucks Band will perform outside at the Maine State Pier – search for www.waterfrontconcerts.com.

Many of you have requested a shorter traditional meeting and we have provided just that by moving the ag tour day to the end of the meeting on Thursday. This means the Annual Business Meeting and Awards Banquet will be Wednesday. The rest of the meeting is fairly traditional with the Sunday reception, the Monday Symposium, and papers and posters filling up the rest of Monday through Wednesday morning.

We are excited to hold our Tuesday evening dinner social in Casco Bay on Peaks Island. Lobster is on the menu. The PAA is still building the endowment funds so please remember to bring something to donate to the Silent Auction.

Lodging

Lodging at the twin towers of the **DoubleTree by Hilton Portland Maine** is \$139 for single or double. Please use the customized hotel registration site http://doubletree.hilton.com/en/dt/groups/personalized/P/PWMMMDT-PAA-20150717/index.jhtml?WT.mc_id=POG. Phone registrations may be done at (207)775-6161 or (800)445-8667. Be sure to mention the Group Name 'THE POTATO ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA (PAA-2015)' and Group Code 'PAA'. Failure to mention this affiliation may result higher rates which cannot be changed at check in. We have not blocked many rooms for Saturday night, so if the registration desk says the room block is full make sure this is not the reason. Nicole Cayer (207)756 6519 can assist if there are difficulties in the process. July is prime vacation time on the Maine coast and less expensive rates will be difficult to find. Please patronize our host hotel to help us attain our quota. The hotel is easy access from the Portland Jetport (2 miles) and Interstate 95. The hotel provides complimentary hotel shuttle service. Across the street is the Maine Mall with many choices for shops and food. The address if arriving by auto is 363 Maine Mall Road, South Portland, Maine 04106. **The guest room block and rate are only available until 5 PM (Eastern Time) June 24.** Rooms, if available, are not guaranteed at the negotiated rate if booked after this cut-off time and date. Also, tell the hotel before or at check-in if your stay will be shortened, otherwise early departure will result in a 50% rate charge. The DoubleTree by Hilton has 219 guest rooms. Rates have not been negotiated with other hotels. There are at least a half dozen other hotels in the vicinity, but only one that would be considered a comfortable walking distance.

Travel

You will want to book your flights to Portland, Maine. The **Portland Jetport (PWM)** is only 2 miles from the DoubleTree by Hilton and the hotel offers free shuttle service. We look forward to seeing you in Portland in July and may you have safe travels.

PAA Members in the News

In January 2015, **Dr. Neil C. Gudmestad**, Univ Distinguished Prof of Plant Pathology at NDSU, was named the **Neil C. Gudmestad Endowed Chair of Potato Pathology**, by NDSU President Dr. Dean Bresciani. The endowed chair position was created as the result of an endowment established by the contributions of potato growers, processors, agricultural chemical manufacturers and other allied industries from throughout the U.S.. Forty donors from 13 states contributed to the Neil C. Gudmestad Endowment in recognition of his many research contributions to the management of potato diseases over a 38 year career. More than \$4.2 million was raised by the donors which in turn obtained a 50% match from the ND Higher Education Challenge Fund, making the total endowment worth \$6.3 million.

The primary purpose of the endowment is to provide assurance that a successor can be identified to continue Dr. Gudmestad's potato pathology research program at a high level upon his retirement, tentatively set for 2019. The endowment advisory committee will provide valuable input as to the important potato disease problems in the U.S. that require research, provide guidance into asset allocation of funds derived from the endowment, and to work with the university to recruit and identify Dr. Gudmestad's successor.
